

- A reference list is an alphabetically arranged **list of the sources** that you used in your research.
- At Mackellar we use the APA 7<sup>th</sup> referencing style.
- All sources that you use, whether specifically referred to in your answer or not, need to be included in your reference list.
- All of the sources must be listed in <u>alphabetical order</u> according to author's last name. DO NOT have separate lists for websites, books, documentaries etc.
- You can use online referencing tools such as MyBib to help you. Just remember to select APA 7<sup>th</sup> and check over the references once they are generated.
- You must pay close attention to using consistent punctuation.

## <u>Books</u>

You need the following information to reference a book;

- **Author**'s last name and initial with a full stop.
- Year of publication in brackets with a full stop after the bracket.
- **Title of the source** in italics (You only need to capitalise the first word and any proper nouns eg. Australia).
- Publisher

When you type this information on the page it should look like this:

Author, A. A. (Year). Title of work. Publisher.

For example,

Jones, C. (2013). *Australian Indigenous Peoples*. Hodder and Stoughton.

## **Reference List Guidelines**

## Websites

You will need the following information to reference a webpage

- Authors' last name(s) and initial(s) or the name of the organisation (corporate author) responsible for the site
- The year that the site was created or last updated
- Title of the website
- Date retrieved (the month and year when you viewed the source)
- URL (web address)

When you type this information on the page it should look like this:

For example

Ray, J. (2011). Voices from Ancient Egypt. Retrieved September, 2016. <a href="http://www.bbc.co.uk/history/ancient/egyptians/human\_gallery.shtml">http://www.bbc.co.uk/history/ancient/egyptians/human\_gallery.shtml</a>

For **multiple authors**, list **all** last names and initials separated by commas and use an & (ampersand) instead of and. E.g. Stanley, G., Reid, M. & Brown, K.

In addition, you must make sure that all of the work that you include in your assignments is your own! You must use your <u>own words</u> and **ALWAYS** acknowledge when you use someone else's work or ideas.
